

## **April 9, 2007 – Meeting Summary**

### **LIPA Transmission Expansion**

CAC reported on the **March 29, 2007** meeting with LIPA officials. The CAC's position is that 100% of the newly proposed lines should be buried underground and the Bridgehampton CAC, the Southampton/Tuckahoe/Shinnecock CAC, the Sag Harbor CAC and Southampton Village Mayor, Mark Epley all share this opinion. LIPA has agreed to come back with an estimate that reflects the actual cost of burying all of the lines along alternative routes, i.e., the newly proposed back-road route, the moraine route, and along Route 27. The negative traffic impact from construction along proposed route and safety and environmental impact were discussed. A SEQRA study would seem necessary. The CAC has asked for a meeting with Supervisor Heaney. A date will be set after the Supervisor reviews LIPA proposal.

### **Public Water Offer**

At the Fire Commissioner's request, the CAC sent a cover letter with the information from the "SCWA" to residents of Rose Hill Road area, Seven Ponds Towd Rd. and part of Edge of Woods Road regarding the offer of public water. Half of the residents need to sign up in order for the Suffolk County Water Department to proceed.

### **Mill Pond Circulators**

All of the money needed to rent four solar-powered water circulation units for one year has been raised with private funds. The units should be installed in Mill Pond by the end of the month. The Town Trustees have requested a one-year test period before agreeing to any private purchase of the units for long term.

### **Hamlet Center Code Violations and Spruce-Up Effort**

Representative CAC members will meet with Councilman Nuzzi on **April 20, 2007** to discuss ongoing code violations and graffiti in Water Mill. A town attorney will give an update on legal actions taken. The Town has installed two new garbage pails in the hamlet. The Town was advised that litter pick up at the bus shelter garbage can must be more frequent. E-mails concerning the run down condition of several buildings in the hamlet have been received and the CAC is reaching out to business owners about keeping up their premises.

### **Water Mill Ateliers (Montauk Hwy and Davids Lane)**

The owner is still waiting for a building permit and will not apply for a demolition permit until his plans have been approved. Town and owner are still working out details and owner hopes to proceed soon.

The next meeting will take place on **May 14, 2007**.
